This time we bring details of this year's application process for grants from Daintree Wind Farm Ltd. under the Community Benefit Scheme, which provides up to £6000 annually for community projects in Kilsby. So if your group or organisation has a project which meets the criteria start the application now.

Elsewhere comes news of progress with the Heritage Board Project, which has been awarded a Heritage Lottery grant. It is hoped to install the boards around the village this spring. It is good to see also that the Kilsby Good Neighbours Scheme now has a coordinator and is launching its work with a Good Neighbours meal on 16th March. We wish every success to this very worthwhile project.

There will be an election for the Parish Council in May and although the current Council now has its full number of councillors, with Howard Gibbs having recently been co-opted onto it, new people who may wish to stand at the election are being invited to contact the Clerk. If you think you would like to contribute to the village in this way please do consider standing.

The Parish Council has been told by Daventry Planning that we must change the signage on our telephone box, which is Grade II Listed. At present some of the signage says 'Defibrillator' and the Conservation Officer wants this changed back to 'Telephone'. The Parish Clerk is asking for residents' views on this. Given there is no longer a telephone in the box and that someone's life may well depend on the location of the defibrillator being easily identified in an emergency, we feel that such a change is both unnecessary and very undesirable. But please let the Clerk know what you think. More information is on page 3.

Elsewhere in the magazine there is news of the usual round of social and fund raising events, including two separate quizzes in March, the return of the Village Hall cinema, a coffee morning, and Knit and Knatter groups. The Pre-school are holding another fund-raising Rag Bag Collection, and there is to be another of the annual Litterpicks, which we hope will be very well supported as it makes such a difference to the appearance of the village. You could also help to make the village look nice by joining the mowing rota for the churchyard. Finally, the Council is looking for ways for the village to celebrate the 75th anniversary of VE Day in May, so please let them have your ideas.

We hope you find lots in this edition to interest and inspire you to get involved..

#### Parish Council Notice of new meeting dates

Due to the 7<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 Parish Council Elections we must change the dates of our May and June meetings in 2020 from the 1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday of the month.

Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 – Kilsby Parish Council Ordinary Meeting.

The Annual Parish Meeting this year is proposed to be on Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> April, 2020 (7.00 pm - 8.00 pm). This is a non-political meeting for parishioners. We invite village organisations to attend to share news about their groups and projects. If you are willing to stand as a Parish Councillor at the 7<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 elections please contact the Clerk to express interest. You will be supported in the process.

#### **New Councillor**

We wish to welcome our eleventh member to the team, Councillor Howard Gibbs. Howard is already the village Highways Warden and was co-opted at our December 2019 meeting. Welcome Howard.

#### **New Play Equipment**

Kilsby Parish Council, on behalf of the Kilsby Recreation Ground Charity, has successfully applied for a grant from Daventry District Council Community Grants S106 for play equipment totalling £14,229.80. We are pleased to let you know that the play equipment is scheduled for installation towards the end of March 2020. The installation will take approximately one week and part of the Recreation Ground where the work is to be carried out will be temporarily and securely closed.

#### **Heritage Project**

The Parish Council has applied for a DDC Section 106 amenity space grant for £1,250.00 to go towards the costs of our heritage project. Hopefully, towards the end of February 2020 we will hear if we have been successful.

As part of this fund raising we have also received confirmation that our National Lottery Heritage Fund application for £7,500.00 has been successful. A donation from a resident has also been pledged towards one of the information boards. The nine information history boards will be sited around Kilsby Village. The working group has submitted a separate update on this project covering the proposed positions of the boards. This is on page 14 of this magazine. Do please read it.

### K6 Telephone Kiosk, Kilsby – located at Main Road, Kilsby

We have received an email from Daventry District Council Conservation/Planning Department telling us that the 'defibrillator' signage at the top of our Grade II red telephone box must be changed back to its original 'telephone' signage.

They have advised '...It is a very simple, functional structure; its historic use as a communal telephone box is integral to its character and appearance, and therefore, we feel that the change to the signage changing the traditional 'telephone' sign to a modern 'defibrillator' sign, is not appropriate. We would prefer that all of the Grade II Listed Telephone Boxes in the district retain their traditional exterior appearance'.

We can apply for listed building consent for the signage alternation to 'defibrillator' but the officer has advised it is likely to be refused. We have been invited to make comments to Daventry District Council and Kilsby Parish Council would very much like to hear your thoughts. Please write to/email the Clerk.

#### **Tree Survey**

A tree survey has just been completed for the Parish Council. A copy of the tree survey report can be found on our website.

We are currently seeking quotes for work to trees identified in the 6 to 12 month categories of the survey with hope to complete work soon.

We are also seeking quotes to attend to overgrown vegetation within Butts Lane (EW13). On advice from experts we may have to tackle the lane in stages according to priority and as an ongoing project. The aim is to improve the footpath.

Work to the Cemetery, including hedges, trees and levelling of a numbers of graves, is being looked into as are other areas around the village.

#### Speed reduction

We previously reported that the speed review panel was looking at our request to revise the speed limit on the A361 from the existing start of the 30 mph limit (coming from the Ashby St Ledgers direction) to

40 mph and then starting the 30 mph limit at the M45 Bridge. The Panel is chaired by Northamptonshire Highways Road Safety Manager and consists of safety engineers, road safety practitioners and the Senior Traffic Management Officer for Northamptonshire Police who has delegated authority from the Chief Constable in speed limit consultations.

The Panel supported the revision, considering that the current 30 mph restriction starts so far out of the main residential section of the village there is no realistic prospect of compliance until a driver gets further into the village. The request, legal process and completing the review mean the amended restrictions will not be introduced until the latter half of 2020. Now that the Panel has met, the request for Police speed checks in the village along the A361 is again being reviewed.

#### Houlton

We have been informed that The Transforming Lives Educational Trust has drafted the Admissions Policy for Houlton School in accordance with the school's funding agreement parameters. The policy is currently being reviewed by DfE consultants. They anticipate that the policy will be made available for public consultation early in the New Year, and encourage Kilsby Parish Council, along with all other stakeholders, to provide them with comments.

#### **Finances**

Parish Council Village grants have been approved to the following organisations:

- Kilsby Pre-school, £199.98 for IT Equipment for learning and development;
- Kilsby Playgroup (Playtime), £374.00 for a playball kit.

We also continue to support Kilsby Youth Club.

The Parish Precept for 2020/2021 is £44,650. This is a reduction of 4.9% on the 2019/2020 precept. Budget information for 2020/2021 can be found on our website and on the village notice board in Essen Lane.

The Parish Council mowing contract for 2020/2022, which includes verges, the Recreation Ground and the Cemetery has been awarded to Daventry Norse Ltd. who are looking forward to starting with us. They will understandably need a period of settling in and to become familiar with the whole village mowing plan; it's a big area. However, they are well prepared and equipped for the task!

#### Crime and Policing

Since the last edition of the KK there has been a good deal of commentary on vehicle crime in the area, particularly regarding thefts from vehicles and interference to vehicles. Kilsby crimes circulated by the police via the Neighbourhood Watch email alerts in the period are:

- Overnight on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> December, one van was broken into and tools stolen, and another was damaged but nothing stolen.
- Overnight on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> January, a car had its number plates stolen and wing mirrors broken, and a van was damaged but nothing taken.

Other villages in the area have experienced similar activity.

I'm aware of reports on social media of other instances of vehicle crime which haven't appeared on the NHW alert system. This means either that the crime was reported and the police have no need of additional information (ie they've solved it), or it wasn't reported to the police in the first place. If you have been the victim of a crime you may not consider it worth reporting to the police on the basis that they are busy or will "do nothing". However, if the police don't know about it they can't build up a picture of the activity to assist in their investigations. Although you may not get an instant result in the form of an arrest, it may well make a difference in the longer term. Not only that, your insurer may require a crime number.

Call 101 to report a crime which has already occurred, or 999 if you see a crime in progress or if life is in danger.

At a recent regular Councillor meeting with Stephen Mold, Police Commissioner for Northamptonshire, Stephen outlined a draft proposal for the installation of Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras throughout the county. This would be in conjunction with local councils, and there will be an associated cost, but it may be an effective means to mitigate the kind of crime we have recently experienced. Your Parish Council is awaiting further information on this.

#### **Daventry District Neighbourhood Police Team**

It has been announced that Sgt Sam Dobbs is stepping down as Daventry District Neighbourhood Policing Sergeant at the end of February to take up a position at Police Headquarters. He will be replaced, initially at least, by Sgt Simon Pinchin.

Our Area PCSOs Craig Egdell and Tara Cooksammy remain in post.

#### **Trial Urban Meadow Project**

Mother Nature has conspired against us and due to the wet weather we've not been able to rotivate and sow wildflower seeds on the area of Malt Mill Green where the grass has been sprayed and killed off. We've now agreed that we will wait until late March, which will hopefully still allow time for a reasonable display in the summer. However the first season will require some management to ensure that unwanted weeds and grass do not re-establish themselves. If unwanted weed species emerge these will need removing either by hand or by carefully spot treating with a weedkiller. Weeds are more likely to show in the first year after sowing, but thereafter the wildflowers should become dominant.

Towards the end of the summer most flowers will begin to die back and this is the time to make the 'hay cut'. The area will want cutting down to around 10 cm with the cuttings being left to dry on the surface for up to a week. This will allow the cut flowers to shed their seed. The cuttings can then be raked up and removed. I'm thinking that this would provide a great opportunity for the village community to get together for a worthwhile cause, so watch this space!

First of all, a very Happy New Year to you all.

With the general election in mid-December, then the Christmas/ New Year closure at DDC, there is little to report. Routine business continues as usual, even though some officers have been seconded to work on plans for the new unitary councils, which start operating in May 2021.

The legislation to set up the new councils was delayed because of the general election, but I understand that it is now trundling through parliament. In May this year there will be elections for the Shadow Authority of West Northamptonshire. This body will be responsible for the details of how the new West Northamptonshire Council will work, its staffing, services and budget. As the new unitary authority will consist of Daventry District, South Northamptonshire, and Northampton Borough, I understand that there will be a total of 93 councillors. This number will decrease after one year, when the unitary authority comes into being.

The latest cost of setting up the new unitary councils is estimated at £43.5 million, and the annual savings at £85 million.

Another election in May this year, of much more importance locally, is for the Parish Council. All Parish Councils in the county will be up for election, so now is the time for you to think about whether you have a contribution to make to the running of Kilsby. Have you the skills and ideas and energy to help the village continue to be the excellent community that it is? Think about putting your name forward.

I was interested to read an item in one of my papers last week. Several years ago applications for wind farms locally caused great controversy, and there were cries of 'not enough wind here', and other objections The item stated that at 7.00 pm on Saturday, 11th January, 34% of the UK's electricity was being generated by wind. With all our concerns about the warming of the planet from CO2 emissions, I think it's 'case made'.

Remember I can be contacted on any District Council matter. My details are at the head of this article and I will be pleased to hear from you, and particularly from new residents in our village.



# Update on Kilsby's Heritage Board Project

(From Heritage Board Project Working Group – Clare Valentine; Jenny Fisher; Richard Thompson; Clive Thompson; Robin Nicholls and Janet Chappell)

In the April-May 2019 edition of Kilsby Kronickle the Parish Council advised you of our plans to locate around the village nine information boards celebrating Kilsby's heritage. A presentation about the boards and options for wording and funding took place on 21 May 2019 at the Annual Parish Meeting.

Following the presentation, an application was made to the Heritage Lottery Fund for help in funding the project. We can now advise that we have been told that, provided we can satisfy various formalities with them, we have been awarded the full amount applied for. We would like to thank Kilsby WI, the Red Lion pub and Kilsby Village Community Shop for providing letters in support of our application.

We can now go ahead with finalising the layout, in advance of ordering the actual boards, and we will also be updating the Kilsby Historic Village Trail leaflet.

Eight of the nine boards relate to specific areas of the village so those particular board will each need to be in proximity to that area and meet Highway Regulations. A walk around the village has identified a specific location for each board as follows -

- Secure to brick wall of Stoneleigh, Middle Street on the Essen Lane corner near to council noticeboard.
- On the grass where The Banks meets the A361 between the sweet chestnut and prunus trees looking out towards the A361 development.
- On the grass in front of the Independent Chapel probably between the planter and the connecting path at right angles to the church.
- At the Independent St Main Rd junction on the grass between Cedar Lodge and the zebra crossing, halfway between the large tree and the zebra crossing.
- In front of the hedge at Laurelcroft, North Street and c2500cm from the road; angled towards Hunt House.
- In front of the Village Hall wall to the left of the "Salt" bin and far enough back not to impede overflow car parking

- At the top of Church Walk on the right; in front of the shrub just before the gateway to the church leaving sufficient space to prune the shrub.
- Secured to the brick wall at the A5 side of Church Walk opposite the Church Walk junction.
- On Malt Mill Green on the Daventry Rd side in line with the Butts Lane entrance, not far from the bench but angled towards Emery Row.

If anyone wishes to comment on any of the locations described, we will listen to and accommodate any alternative suggestions where we can. But please be aware that there are only limited options for where the boards can be installed, as each board will need to be in proximity to the area it describes. Please send any comments to Clare Valentine as the Parish Clerk (contact details on page 2).

We are hoping to get the boards installed in the spring of 2020 and will be organising an unveiling event at that time. We will be keeping you informed of progress.

#### **GARDENERS' CORNER**

Squelchy! Our borders are still far too waterlogged to get on. We seem to have spent most of the time this winter chasing squirrels away from our tulip pots and then having to replant the bulbs.

#### Delay planting and sowing

The ground will be cold because it is so wet, so don't be too hasty sowing or planting – things will just sulk and rot. It is best to wait until after a period of dry high pressure weather and wind to dry things out. You can always sow in pots or trays and plant out later.

#### Complete pruning

Pruning is a job that can be done despite wet ground, so trim up all your trees, shrubs and climbers. Make sure all the retaining ties are secure ready for the March winds.

#### Clean drains and gutters

The birds are already spreading moss everywhere as they look for food and think of nesting. The moss and winter leaves can block gutters and drains, so take the chance to clear them out while you wait for the ground to dry.

#### Take cuttings of greenhouse plants

Plants such as geraniums that you have kept over the winter should have usable shoots by early March. So take cuttings, using a low nutrient sandy compost and keep them on the dry side or they will rot.

#### Jobs to do in February

- Divide perennials
- Sprout seed potatoes in a frostproof light place
- Sow broad beans
- Clean up your garden paths

#### Jobs to do in March

- Sow hardy annuals in seed trays or pots.
- Prune roses once the risk of hard frost is past
- Sow leeks and onions when the soil is ready

#### Times past...

"A mild February is the forerunner of a miserable summer and a poor year for the harvester of outdoor crops. Watch your daffodils – almost invariably when they have not shown above ground by the beginning of February, the year that follows has high mean temperatures, long hours of sunshine and a useful rainfall."

#### **Fund Overview**

The Fund allows groups to apply for grants between £250 and £6,000. There is one application round to apply to each year.

The application closing date for 2020 is: Wednesday 8 April

#### **Project Location**

Projects for which grants are requested must be located in the Parishes of Crick or Kilsby.

#### **Project Purpose**

Priority will be given to:

- Energy efficiency or renewable energy projects, such as insulation, efficient boilers or small scale renewable energy installations
- Training or education projects, especially vocational training for unemployed young people under the age of 25 years old
- Projects for school age children, or older people
- Any other community projects for the benefit of residents of the local area

For full details of what can be funded (there are limited exceptions), please see the Funding Criteria, available on GrantScape's website.

#### **Eligible Organisations**

Eligible Organisations, who can apply for funding include:

- Voluntary, community groups
- Parish Councils
- Schools and educational establishments
- Social enterprises (including credit unions, co-operatives, social firms, community owned enterprises, community interest companies and development trusts) provided they operate on a not-for-profit basis



Applicants need to have a written constitution, a set of rules, or a governing document and a bank or building society account held in the name of the organisation in place before applying for a grant. If you don't have these please consider asking if the Parish Council can apply on your behalf.

Applicants can apply for further grants each year, however, they may not receive priority over organisations that have previously been turned away or those who are applying for the first time.

#### **Making Grant Recommendations**

Recommendations as to which projects should receive funding are made by two locals Panels, one representing Crick and the other Kilsby.

We have a lot of activities and trips planned for the next few months, so in the next Kronickle you will hear all about these.





- Use less of the things you only use once:
  - put your packed lunch in a lunch box instead of wrapping it in cling film or tinfoil
  - use a reusable water bottle instead of a one use plastic one




- save left over food to eat later or the next day


