5.1	To discuss current draft of Kilsby Neighbourhood Plan v2 – feedback and comment from Councillors
	<p>Note that unchanged text is black, new text is blue, comments are in red and any text needing correction is highlighted yellow.</p> <p>Note also that further drafts are awaiting 2021 census information, and technical support to develop and incorporate design codes.</p> <p>DDC has suggested the community infrastructure projects should be listed in a separate appendix, Appendix V. The potential for walking and cycling routes have been moved to here (Policy K2 refers) and also included are the potential for a GP surgery and permanent village shop. (Policy K1 refers). Are there any other infrastructure projects which should be referenced in the NDP and could be activated if / when developments come forward in the future, e.g. traffic calming measures?</p> <p>Some locations have been added to the Local Green Space table. These and existing locations should be reviewed. There are a number of clauses where the Parish Council is specifically mentioned as having a policy. These policies need to be confirmed.</p> <p>4.3.16 The Parish Council supports the identification of several green spaces within Kilsby for protection as Local Green Space.</p> <p>4.4.7 The Parish Council will seek measures such as improvements in public transport provision and cycle routes which support improved accessibility to nearby commercial centres such as DIRFT, Daventry and Rugby.</p> <p>4.5.6 There is an adequate bus service (services D1 and D2) linking Kilsby to Daventry and Braunston, although there is no service on Sundays which the Parish Council would like to see maintained.</p>
5.2	Specific actions for the Parish Council to address and confirm
	<p>4.4.8 - This policy is supported by the following actions by the Parish Council:</p> <p>Action 7: Encouraging commercial centre employers to advertise vacancies in the village magazine and in the Post Office & Stores.</p> <p>Action 8: Promoting increased reliability of the electricity supply and mobile phone networks.</p>

	<p>4.5.17 - The Parish Council will commit to continued actions to ensure improvements to traffic calming and road safety. Such actions will include:</p> <p>Action 1. Ensuring Northamptonshire County Council maintains public footpaths in a good state of repair by reporting any problems with stiles and vegetation.</p> <p>Action 2. To combat the growing problem of speeding cars and HGVs through the village instigating Community Speed Checks by trained volunteers.</p> <p>Action 3. Lobbying the Highways Authority to introduce improved signage, including weight limits at the entrances to the village.</p> <p>Action 4. Lobbying the Highways Authority to reduce the speed limit through the village to 20 mph.</p> <p>Action 5. The Parish Council will seek effective prevention of HGV parking in the two lay-bys on the A5 in the village. Prohibition has little or no effect in the lay-by where overnight parking is currently prohibited. The lay-bys would either need to be closed, or bollards erected which would allow cars to enter and exit but not HGVs.</p> <p>Action 6. The Parish Council will support proposals for traffic calming measures, such as road narrowing and pinch points, to improve highway safety.</p> <p>4.5.19 - Action 7: The Parish Council will seek to ensure that new development aligns with infrastructure improvements. The Parish Council aims to work with developers to make sure that the provision of water, sewerage, electricity, broadband and medical facilities are suitable to meet the future needs of the village.</p>
