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<b>1</b>	<b>APOLOGIES</b>		
1.1	Apologies (personal) received and accepted from both Cllrs Page and Nicholls. Cllr Gent was absent.		
<b>2</b>	<b>PUBLIC OPEN FORUM SESSION <i>limited to 20 mins.</i></b>		
2.1	Two parishioners were present who have expressed an interest in joining the Parish Council. The Chairman welcomed the parishioners to the meeting and the Parishioners in turn introduced themselves to the PC.		
2.2	<p>Report from District Cllr Lomax: Daventry Council have agreed to a 10 year plan to double the tree cover in the district and encourage community groups and developers to plant and increase the tree cover by 100%. The incentive will rely on new unitary and other organisations to help roll out.</p> <p>Electricity savings and big switch initiatives are currently on offer with funding available via .gov. Consider join public buying groups as national collective. Companies are offering 100% renewable tariffs and some households saved over £200 per year going to the big switch.</p> <p>The Government is to go ahead with new planning policies which will give developers the chance to develop without going through the normal process. Worryingly nothing is mentioned yet about affordable housing and CIL.</p> <p>Encouraging that the PC are looking at renewing our own Kilsby neighbourhood development plan. We do not yet know if the government will allow any local say in the new planning policies yet.</p> <p>Cllr Lomax has also looked into the new issue that there has been an issue at DDC and the grey waste and green waste bins at the Cemetery bins are no longer to be classed for collection with household bin routes but KPC will have to arrange commercial collections. DDC rules applied do not include the free service to the Cemetery. KPC have been contacted about ANPR suggestion by Police on Rugby Road for Sept Agenda.</p>

4.1	<p>The Full Council minutes of 16<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 were approved and signed as correct record with following addition to P282 2.2 "Report from District Cllr Lomax".</p> <p><i>As an additional note for last meeting: It is also noted for minute reference that following the last meeting Cllr Page (not present at 18<sup>th</sup> August Extraordinary Meeting) reconsidered his position of declaring interests at 21<sup>st</sup> July 2020 meeting and considers that he does have an interest in item DA/2020/0384 due to its location and confirmed in writing to the Clerk and Council. The Council RESOLVED to minute this as record.</i></p>		
<b>5</b>	<b>PLANNING</b>		
5.1	<i>New applications</i>		
5.1.1	<p>DA/2020/0384 Construction of 5 dwellings. Land Adjacent 16, Barby Road, Kilsby, Northamptonshire Deadline 19<sup>th</sup> August, 2020.</p> <p>It was <b>RESOLVED</b> to object to the application at this stage.</p> <p>The PC considered our Neighbourhood Development Plan in particular to whether it meets elements within the sections K3 &amp; K4 of the plan and also agreed to the following comments:</p> <p>The design does not appear to consider the use of local materials. Lack of current pavement access to the development along Barby Road. Lack of Street Lighting.</p> <p>Parking arrangements on site appear compact. This also appears a particular issue for two of the properties. Concern for parking directly in front of one neighbouring property and the potential resident disputes that could arise from this suggested parking space plan.</p> <p>Five additional households attract visitors or additional vehicles which may result in overflow parking problem and use of Barby Road, impacting existing residents and road safety.</p> <p>This area is prone to speeding traffic as an entrance to the village and a speed proposal should be provided to show safe access to the proposal.</p> <p>Extension to the start of the 30mph speed signs should be considered and/or speed reduction programme with a</p>		

	40mph limit introduced before 30mph to slow traffic before reaching this new development. It would appear that there is lack of space on the proposal for safe turning points and to access waste bins on site
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	and is tight with parked vehicles resulting in waste bins likely being left on Barby Road.
